Helen Boucher has worked as an infectious disease physician for three decades as one of the nation's foremost authorities on antimicrobial resistance (AMR). After joining Tufts University 2002, she co-founded the Stuart B. Levy Center for Integrated Management of Antimicrobial Resistance and served as Chief of the Division of Geographic Medicine and Infectious Diseases before being named Dean of the Tufts University School of Medicine. Prof. Boucher's research focuses on infections in immunocompromised patients and on antibiotic-resistant *Staphylococcus aureus*, one of the world's top infectious disease threats. As a leader in the AMR community, Prof. Boucher has served on the Presidential Advisory Council on Combating Antibiotic-Resistant Bacteria.
